The drop in Sumter County homeless counts between 2015 and 2016 was due to reclassification of most of the emergency beds to permanent housing, which is not counted during the Point in Time Count. In 2018 they were reclassified once again as transitional housing, but during and again between 2018 and 2019 when the beds were removed from the housing inventory because the facility was being run as a residential program, where the
