<p>Inflow – Outflow</p>	<p>out in the streets by law enforcement. The outreach team is also working on identifying areas for the point in time census. Barbara also reported that the first time homeless is data that needs to be analyzed. We need to determine whether we are finding people when they are newly homeless or after they have been on the streets for a length of time.</p> <p>TANF -- Stacy reported that \$4,685.08 has been spent during the months of November and December; thus, their underspending has been rectified.</p> <p>ESG-CV – A discussion about non-congregate shelter was held. We need to evaluate whether non-congregate shelter funds are needed, and if not, whether than can be reallocated to another program.</p> <p>Paula reported that HUD is now sharing the spend down numbers for HUD CoC programs, and she presented the new slide. Stacy reported that they were given a one-month extension on their contract, and they have spent an additional \$12,000. She’s had a conversation with the HUD Field Representative, and due to COVID and the lack of housing, programs across the State and turning back funding. Lake County’s grant officially ended on September 30th. Tomi reported that there was a person that Lake was about to house and on the last day of the grant, the landlord backed out. Funds not spent will be recaptured by HUD. Stacy also reported that the Exits to unhoused were due to incarcerations and household choosing not to stay in County after they had already been entered into the program.</p> <p>BNL & Inflow & Outflow. There was a question about how COVID might be the cause for the increase in homelessness. Paula reported that MFHC started more accurately tracking COVID as a cause in August. The number to date is 12.</p> <p>Presentation by Citrus County Housing – their project for 2019-2020 ended in September. Tammy reported that there was an increase in income of leavers, which included one person getting married and moving out of state. There was also an increase of income for stayers through successful case management. There was in Increase in benefits, new benefits, as well as employment. They did have one person that was incarcerated, but he hadn’t been leased up at the time. They had one lease up and then leave the state. There are still five participants that have been getting services for longer than 1,000 days. They have Implemented a stronger move-on plan, but some are still receiving intensive case management. They</p>	
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	recently had a participant that had been in the program for a while, and Citrus received approval to move her into the Section 8 program. They applied for CoC Waivers for COVID in case they couldn't meet match.	
	LSA - Paula reported that she is uploading data to HUD, and as she gets error messages, she continues to investigate the causes and is working to get data cleaned up. The deadline has been moved from the end of December to January 15, 2021. System Performance Measures will due in end of March. She'll be bringing data to the committee prior to submission. The Point in Time is scheduled for 1/26/2020. MFHC still working on a plan.	
Monitoring & Training Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tomi reported that she will be scheduling monitoring or technical assistance for all ESG-CV subrecipients. • All HUD program have been monitored. She commended Citrus County Housing for their program, and implementing recommendations from previous monitoring reports. • The United Way of Lake and Sumter has returned their CAP forms, and Tomi is scheduling their follow-up monitoring for December. St. Vincent de Paul received two Corrective Action Plans and their response is due in January. There are two other reports that should go out this week after Barbara reviews them. 	
ESG-CV & HUD CoC Grant Update	Barbara reported that we are still waiting or word from HUD about the 2020 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). The State is routing their plan for ESG-CV2 funds, and we are just waiting to hear the details of the plan.	
Announcements	Steve asked for any information about additional CARES funding, and Veda reported that all counties are waiting to hear if there will be additional funding and if so, when it will be disseminated. Homeless Person Memorial Day event is on Monday December 21, 2020 at 3:00 p.m. virtually on the MFHC Facebook. Janssen vaccine for homeless population will be distributed by the local health department. One shot and done.
