# FY2021 HUD NOFO

## NEW for 2021

1. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Public Law 116-260, approved December 27, 2020) amended title IV section 435 of the Act to allow Indian Tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHE) to be Collaborative Applicants...
2. Using the Housing First model to prioritize rapid placement and stabilization is returning in the FY 2021 CoC Program Competition
3. HUD will incentivize CoCs that create projects that coordinate with housing providers and healthcare organizations to provide permanent housing and rapid rehousing services
4. HUD increased the number of points related to CoC coordination with PHAs
5. HUD revised its evaluation of racial disparity from the FY 2019 CoC Program NOFO to place focus on racial equity and increased the number of points
6. A new category has been added to Section VII.B of this NOFO to promote inclusion in the local planning process of current and former homeless persons with lived experience to: a. address homelessness; b. determine how local policies may need to be revised and updated; c. participate in CoC meetings and on committees as stakeholders; d. provide input for decisions; and e. provide input related to the local competition process
7. Determining the impact of COVID-19 as CoCs faced challenges due to the outbreak of COVID-19 affecting individuals and families experiencing homelessness in congregate and non-congregate shelter or housing as well as increased risks for individuals and families experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

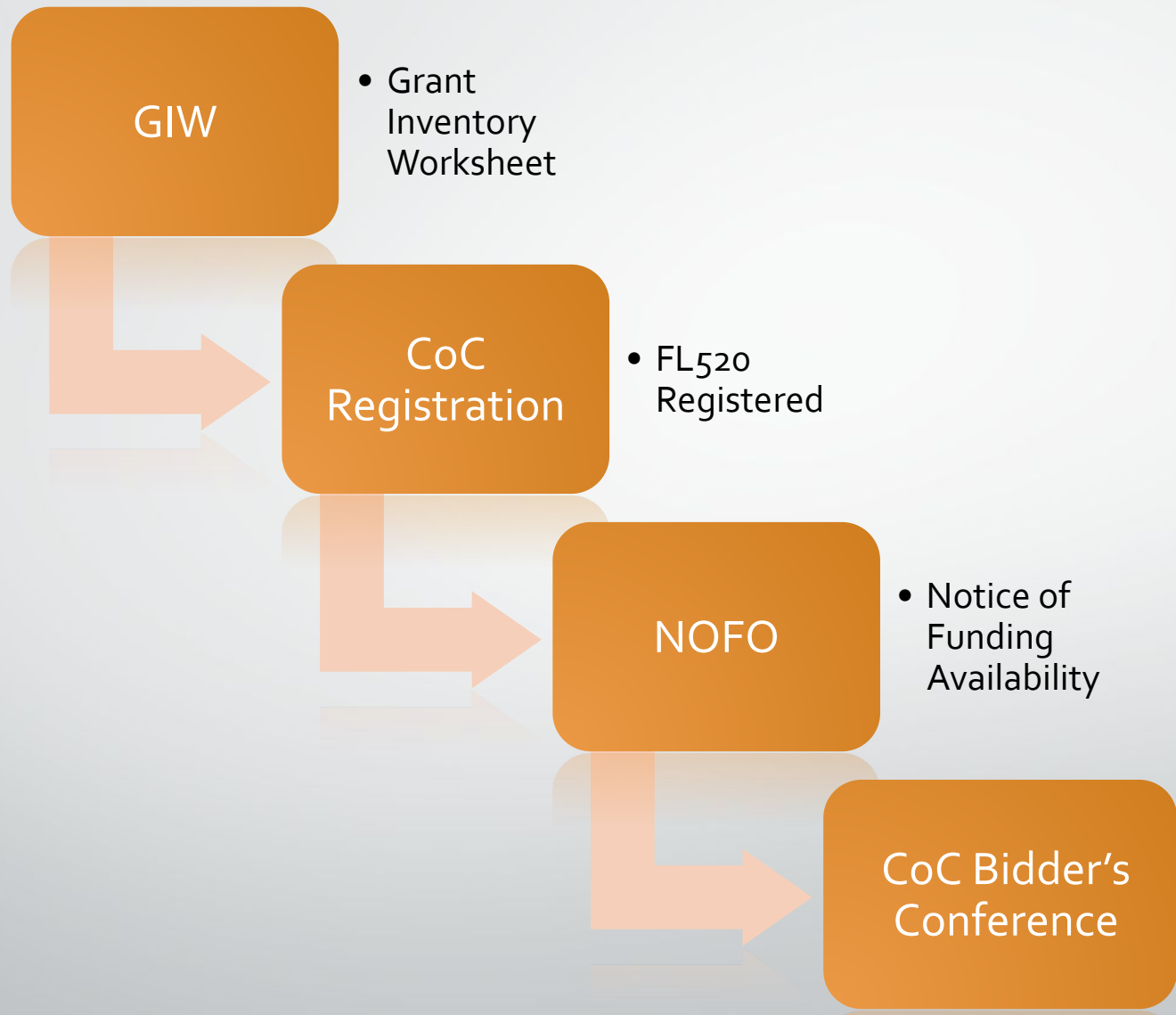

- **Supportive services projects (SSO – Coordinated Entry)**

### New Projects for DV Bonus

- **PH-RRH** projects dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that are defined as homeless at 24 CFR 578.3
- Joint TH & PH-RRH component projects as defined in Section III.C.3.m of this NOFA dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that are defined as homeless at 24 CFR 578.3
- Supportive service only-coordinated entry project to implement policies, procedures, and practices that equip the CoC's coordinated entry to better meet the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking

# FY2021 HUD NOFO

## Project Applications - New & Renewals

- Must be a paid member of Mid Florida Homeless Coalition, Inc.
- Applicants must complete and submit their applications in *e-snaps* at <https://esnaps.hud.gov/> by **October 15, 2021 by 4:30pm**
- Applicants must complete a 2021 HUD Request for Proposals (RFP) Supplement. It and all attachments must be received in the Mid Florida Homeless Coalition office by **October 15, 2021, 4:30pm**

# FY2021 HUD NOFO

## Renewals

### Consolidations

- HUD encourages the consolidation of eligible renewal grants
- New for the FY 2021 CoC Program Competition, grant recipients have the option to consolidate up to ten of their eligible renewal projects into one grant
- Read Consolidating Eligible Renewals instructions

Expansion Projects The process by which a renewal project submits a new project application to expand its current program by adding units, beds, persons served, services provided to existing program participants. Applicant must submit separate Renewal and New Project application and both must be ranked with unique numbers

# FY2021 HUD NOFO Renewals

## Required documents for a Renewal Project application

1. E-snaps Project application, DUE October 15, 2021, 4:30 PM
2. Most recent CoC APR for the renewal project printed from the SAGE Repository
3. Canned HMIS Data Quality Report [FY 2020] printed from Clarity (date range must match the APR date range for most recent submitted APR report in SAGE)
4. A printout from the project's eLOCCS account of the General, Budget and Vouchers tab for the most recently ended grant term. (See Instructions for Finding Project's eLOCCS Information Guide). Most recently ended grant term -defined as the grant term in which APR and final eLOCCS draw
5. A copy of the agency's 2020 Audited Financials report and most recently submitted 990
6. Housing First/Low Barrier Questionnaire – **Completed**
7. A copy of Agency written policies and procedures for the program in which you are submitting a project renewal application
8. Non-profit status verification (Copy of 501(c)(3) Internal Revenue Service tax exemption) unless on file with Mid Florida Homeless Coalition
9. Proof of SAM registration showing an update within the last year.

## FY2021 HUD NOFO NEW CoC Bonus

Required documents for a NEW CoC Project application

1. **Letter of Intent – DUE October 8, 2021, 2 p.m. EST**
2. E-snaps Project application, DUE October 15, 2021 4:30 PM
3. A copy of the agency's 2020 Audited Financials report and most recently submitted 990
4. Housing First/Low Barrier Questionnaire – **Completed**
5. A copy of Agency written policies and procedures for the program in which you are submitting a project application
6. Non-profit status verification (Copy of 501(c)(3) Internal Revenue Service tax exemption) unless on file with Mid Florida Homeless Coalition
7. Most recent Annual Performance Report out of SAGE if operating a similar program in another CoC, or an Annual Performance Report out of HMIS for non-HUD CoC projects being operated in the CoC, or Annual Performance Report out of HMIS comparable database if a victim service provider.
8. Canned HMIS Data Quality Report printed from Clarity (date range 10/1/2020 - 9/30/2021).
